Course Description

ART 515 New Media Art I and ART 516 New Media Art II (1-7 per semester/maximum of 14) Individual problems in new media arts practice leading to development of a body of work representative of the artist.

Class Structure

Class participants will meet to discuss their own work as a group. When appropriate, students will meet individually with the instructor. Readings and resources will be shared via Angel in support of the discussions that take place throughout the semester.

Students need to turn in a reflective evaluation of the work they presented in class. Instructions of the process will be made available around the middle of the term.

Beginning the week after thanksgiving, participants will present their work to the group.

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. To understand how form and content are combined to communicate a message.
- 2. To understand the basic history and theory that is relevant to art and visual culture.
- 3. To acquire a basic understanding of conceptual models important in visual culture and especially new media practice.
- 4. To gain practical knowledge of the different tools used for art practice in new media, and their relation to previous developments.
- 5. To produce critically engaged projects.
